The large center island, with sink, storage cabinets, pullouts and overhead lighting, actually appears less like a prep area than a stage for a Puccini opera.

Then, we added the hardware...weighty and hand-forged in a rouge patina finish. The backsplashes...Venetian tile, utilizing a warm and welcoming Tuscan design. And finally, the surrounding eating-bars and counter spaces...topped with Italian Giallo Napoleon granite.

Appliances...Thermador and Sub-Zero, of course.

Our budget: \$60,000. Actual cost: \$57,625.
